Stourbridge MP Visits Boro Foundry

As part of the 'Made in Britain' campaign Stourbridge MP, Margot James, visited the Boro Foundry, at Lye in the West Midlands, on 23rd August to survey one of the candidates shortlisted for the Made in Britain' Growing Business awards. Sponsored by Real Business Magazine, these awards recognise UK manufacturing industry.

Whilst there, Margot James inspected one of the newly machined driving wheels for 'The Unknown Warrior' and met David Bradshaw and Andrew Laws from the LMS-Patriot Project, and Bev Edwards from the Boro Foundry. Margot showed a genuine interest in the Patriot Project; she wished us well and expressed the wish to ride behind the new

'Patriot' when completed!

The West Midlands foundry is a specialised manufacturer of castings and machined parts. It is well suited for projects such as the LMS-Patriot Project because they are experts in manufacturing low volume, precision-engineered components. We have had six new driving wheels and other components—including frame stretchers and a centre bogie pin—cast by the Boro Foundry.

Other steam projects have also benefitted from the skilled workmanship of the Boro Foundry including the 82045 Steam Locomotive Trust, The 'Beachy Head' Project and the G5 Project.

Engineering Update

It has been a busy couple of months, with September seeing the completion of several more castings and components.

Twelve Spring hanger brackets were cast and all four frame stretchers have been cast and machined before being delivered to the Llangollen Railway for fitting on the frames of 'The Unknown Warrior'.

Meanwhile, the first four horn guides have been cast and all six horn ties have been cast and delivered to Llangollen

As well as this, all driving wheel castings were completed during September with delivery to the South Devon Railway due in early October. All tyres and axles have already been delivered to the SDR. These have been sourced from South Africa. Crankpin material has also been delivered to the SDR.

Work on some other components has also commenced: all twelve spring hangers have been ordered, all six driving wheel springs (standard with the 'Jubilee' class with 14 leaves) have been ordered from Owen Springs, and Drawings for the six axlebox trunnions are being prepared. A number of smaller parts have been obtained and stored for the future.

Other Items

The driving wheels have been non-destruction tested (NDT'd), have been final machined and had the keyways cut in the West Midlands. Driving wheel 5 needed remedial work prior to Non Destruction Testing and machining. Webs for the inside crank axle have been

manufactured and machined in the West Midlands and will be delivered to the SDR with the wheels. By the beginning of October all materials necessary for the assembly of the wheelsets will be with the SDR, who will commence assembly immediately.

All the tender springs have been overhauled by Owen Springs at Rotherham. The wheelsets have had the tyres turned and journals ground true at Tyseley Loco Works. Tender frame drawings are being borrowed from the London Midland Society 4F group at Bitton and new frames will be made as the existing ones are beyond economic repair. A pattern for the axleboxes has been ordered as only two of the six on the tender are repairable.

Platform steelwork drawings for the running plate are currently in preparation with anticipated completion by end of October then quotes for manufacture and fitting will be obtained. The tender tank drawings have now been completed

Overall we are on course for 'The Unknown Warrior' to be on its driving wheels by June 2012, subject of course to raising the £40,000 required for the final machining and assembly of the wheelsets. These should be at Llangollen for viewing during *Steel, Steam and Stars 3* next April.

This will be a significant proportion of the build costs.

However, since I use C5 envelopes for reply which are quite large, I'm afraid that I have to return your SAE to you. But I'm very grateful to those who just send a second class stamp - during 2010-11 we spent approximately £4000 on postage so every little helps!





Patriot Project Acquires Original Chimney at Derby Auction

Patriot Project Member and supporter David Hughes attended the Sheffield Railwayana Auction at Derbyshire Cricket Club on 10th September. David was bidding for an original Patriot chimney and whistle from 45539 'E. C. Trench'. Ernest Crosbie Trench CBE (1869 - 1960) was Chief Engineer of the LNWR from 1909 to 1922 and the LMS in 1923.

We were fortunate enough to be the highest bidders for the chimney, which sold for £880 plus buyers premium but there was some stiff competition for the whistle. After an intense bidding session, it was eventually sold to another buyer for £700.

David says all is not lost, as he knows of another LNWR type whistle, the correct type for a parallel boiler Patriot. Thanks to David for attending the auction on behalf of the Project and for making a donation towards the chimney, together with another Patriot Project

supporter, who withdrew from bidding for the chimney himself and generously made a donation instead.

For mainline running 'The Unknown Warrior' will need to be built to a reduced height to fit within the 13' 1" Network Rail maximum height required for new railway vehicles. This will entail either lowering the boiler in the frames by 1½" or making a new reduced height chimney to fit within the 13' 1" limit. Depending on what is done, the original chimney that we obtained may be used on the locomotive. It will certainly assist with the making of a new pattern if needed and provide a genuine link with the original locomotives.

We hope to exhibit the chimney, which was unique to the Patriot class, at Llangollen and possibly use it as a temporary donations box at Llangollen Railway Galas. In the longer term we see the chimney being fitted to a new smokebox, complete with smoke deflectors which have already been manufactured and used as a fundraising aid for the remainder of the boiler.
